Dear Parents / Carers,

Welcome back to you all following a restful Easter break! We were blessed with some sunshine and lots of rain. However, the sunshine has given us a bright start to the summer term.



<u>SIAMs INSPECTION</u> - We are receiving a visit from Gill Bradnam, a Diocesan Inspector on Tuesday 24th April. Gill will look at many aspects including:

- our vision for the school as a church school;
- the Christian distinctiveness and ethos of our school as a church school;
- Collective Worship;
- the teaching and learning of RE;
- leadership and management of RE.

To support this visit Gill will be talking to a range of stakeholders including children, staff, governors, parents, clergy throughout the day. The report is subject to quality assurance which we should receive three weeks after the visit when it will be published to you as parents. Please keep the school, staff and children in your ongoing prayers at this time.

<u>SPORT RELIEF</u> - thank you so much for your generosity and donating to Sport Relief. We were able to bank and send off £358.26 for this good cause. The children had a fantastic week taking up the 'Daley' Challenges set for them including: hula-hooping, throwing and catching, boogie, skipping and finishing the week with the mile! Well done everyone.

<u>FUNDRAISING UPDATES</u> — I will be publishing shortly a separate fundraising update as there is a lot to report on! However, the more observant of you will have noticed that we have some new additions to our playground.

- **Co-op Community Fundraising Fund** a fantastic outdoor 'Superstar Performance Stage';
- Mrs Ferguson's mother has donated money over the last few years
 our Humpty Dumpty reading bench by the library;
- Peace Garden work has begun on our Peace Garden with the installation of our 'Amazing Maze' bench engraved with our version of The Lord's Prayer. Most of the money for this has come from a bequest of Ann Bevan (former Chair of Governors).

Further details will be coming shortly of help and other items required to develop some of these outside areas further but I hope you will agree that a fantastic start has already been made!



<u>SUMMER TERM CLUBS</u> - All Summer Clubs begin next week. If your child decides that they no longer wish to attend, please let the office know, as the place can be offered to another child.

If for any reason your child is not able to attend a club session parents must notify the office in writing, and the office staff in turn can notify the club leader not to expect that child for that session. This means we avoid any potential safeguarding issues, particularly with those KS2 children who have authorisation to walk home alone.

<u>ATTENDANCE / PUNCTUALITY</u> — The School day starts at 8.50am, therefore the gates/doors will be opened at 8.40am and closed at 8.50am. Teachers will take registers at 8.50am so any children who arrive after 8.50am will miss the register and be recorded as late. The registers will remain open until 9.00am. Any child arriving after 9.00am will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Lateness is still an issue for some children. Mrs Turnbull (Admissions Officer) and I meet regularly to review attendance and do contact some parents to highlight lower than expected attendance percentages or punctuality issues.

<u>P.E. KIT</u> — Please ensure that your child has their full P.E. kit in school every day, including waterproof trainers, as half of their P.E. lessons take place outdoors and sometimes across in the park. If your child does not have their P.E. kit in school, they will miss out on their lesson. Shorts, joggers and P.E. t-shirts can be purchased from the school office. It is advisable that children do have a warm tracksuit for the colder, wetter weather. There were too many children last week who did not have the appropriate kit in school following the Easter holidays!

<u>WARMER WEATHER</u> — A few reminders as we hopefully approach warmer weather. It is very important that your child has a sun hat, extra drinks and sun cream with them in hot weather. There are sun creams available that last all day. Sun cream should be applied at home before school and if you feel necessary brought to school clearly labelled with your child's name and class. The sun cream must be handed over to your child's class teacher where it will be kept in the classroom. Sun cream must not be kept in children's book bags or trays as it can leak. PLEASE NOTE THAT STAFF ARE <u>NOT ALLOWED</u> TO ADMINISTER SUN CREAM - YOUR CHILD SHOULD BE ABLE TO APPLY IT THEMSELVES. Also a general reminder to ensure all items of school uniform are named clearly as in warmer weather they are often discarded on the playground!

NO DOGS ON SCHOOL PREMISES - This is a polite reminder NO DOGS allowed in the school grounds, this applies to dogs in arms. Dogs can be tied to the fence at the front of the school. There can be no exceptions, if you are not happy to leave your dog tied up unattended then please leave it at home.
