Dear Parents / Carers,

STAFFING - It is with great pleasure that we can announce that Mrs Scott is expecting her first baby in the New Year. We are currently recruiting for her replacement from January 2019. We welcome Miss Garratt to our support staff team. She is splitting her time between EYFS, some 1:1 support and using her sports skills in PE lessons and after school clubs.



<u>ONLINE SAFETY - PARENT TALK / WORKSHOP</u> - On Wednesday 10th October you are invited to a talk / workshop at 2pm with Steve Rowley and Mrs Scott in the school hall. Steve is an Education Consultant who will give a short presentation followed by an open session to answer any of your burning questions. Please feel free to just turn up on the day.

<u>BUILDING WORK</u> - we have two immediate pieces of work that will be shortly taking place and may impact on school life.

- 1. Fencing repairs on the playground. The green picket fencing is to be repaired / replaced as required from 19th October (INSET) onwards. This work should be completed by the end of half term and will allow us to then complete the 'Peace Garden' development which requires fixing items to the fence.
- 2. Roofing works above Y2 corridor. The roofers will set up scaffolding and their compound on 19th October. Their work will continue beyond half term but will not disrupt school life too much. The roof light replacement will take place during half term.


OCTOBER BOOK RECOMMENDATIONS



<u>EARLY YEARS & KS1</u> children is 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers. If you haven't come across this wonderful Oliver Jeffers' picture book yet it is well worth borrowing from the library. This is a wonderful book to share together and to talk about the many amazing things that our world has to offer: lots to look at and much to learn!

For KS2 we would like to recommend 'The Bubble Boy' by Stewart Foster (a local Brighton-based author who has won many awards). This is a story that will enable you to see the world through someone else's eyes: that 'someone' happens to be a young boy living in the 'bubble' of a hospital room. You'll meet some great characters as you read his story!

Another very popular book in school at the moment is 'Do Not Lick this Book' by Idan Ben-Barak. We expect you to wash your hands often after reading this mixture of fiction and non-fiction...all about germs!!
