Not only do our children look smart when adhering to the correct uniform but it ensures health and safety at all times.

HOT WEATHER - It is very important that your child has a named sun hat, named water bottle and sun cream with them in hot weather. There are sun creams available that last all day. Sun cream should be applied at home before school and if you feel necessary brought to school clearly labelled with your child's name and class. The sun cream must be handed over to your child's class teacher where it will be kept in the classroom. Sun cream must not be kept in children's book bags or trays. PLEASE NOTE THAT STAFF ARE NOT ALLOWED TO ADMINISTER SUN CREAM - YOUR CHILD SHOULD BE ABLE TO APPLY IT THEMSELVES.

Any minor cuts or grazes will still be dealt with in school but it is not necessary to record this on paper. If the injury is more serious we will contact you by telephone.
