Children can help raise money for Sport Relief by taking part in one of our 'sporty' activities in school. It is important that a suggested donation of  $\pounds 1$  is made if your child comes to school dressed in sporty clothes – as red as you like – so that we can raise as much money as possible for this charity. <u>VOLUNTEER READERS</u> are you able to spare some time to come into school and help listen to children read? If you would like to be a volunteer reader, please come into the school office for more information on how to apply. Owing to the importance of ensuring all our children's safety, all parents who help in school must be police checked. Please do not let this put you off volunteering to help in school, as we really do value your help.



<u>CAN YOU HELP?</u> We are looking for some volunteers to help us with our newly stocked library. As a Primary School we will be using system called 'Junior Librarian' to enable us to monitor the children's borrowing and keep a check on our book. West Sussex Library Services are visiting to help us set up the system but we need a couple of parent volunteers to help us. If you could spare a couple of hours a fortnight (or more if possible!) please let the school office or Miss Atkinson in Year 3 know as soon as possible. We can then arrange a mutually convenient time to meet up (perhaps an afternoon before you pick up your child/ren. Thank you.

<u>MEDICINES</u> Please remember that medicines/inhalers can only be handed to and collected from a member of the medicines team - Mrs Denyer and, in her absence, Mrs Northrop/Mrs Shentall. Please go to the office where one of the staff will arrange for you to see a member of the medicines team. All children with medicines/inhalers must have a Healthcare Plan in place. This will be drawn up with you and a member of the medicines team. Under the new guidance lipsalve is classed as a cosmetic and should not be in school. If your child needs lipsalve in school you will need to complete a health needs form available from the medicines team.

<u>SCOOTERS & BICYCLES</u> Scooters and bicycles are not to be ridden on school premises. Please ensure that your child saves scooting and cycling for when they have left the school.
