As we launch into Advent this week the children are going to be reflecting on and finding out about 'Christmas Worship Around the World'. <u>CHRISTMAS FAIR</u> - Thank you for all your wonderful donations that FOHPS received on Friday. The committee had sorted the items by 10.30am and are working really hard to ensure we have a wonderful Christmas Fair. If you can help please notify them or the office asap. Finally, don't forget cakes next Friday!!

<u>WEAR IT FESTIVE!</u> - The staff are supporting St Barnabas Hospice on Friday 14th December with their 'Wear it Festive' fundraising campaign. They may bring out their best Christmas Jumpers, Antlers or Santa hats for the occasion!

We are making this totally **optional** for the children given recent requests for trips and the Christmas Fair. If they wish to join in and can bring a small donation in for St Barnabas that would be lovely. Please give any donations to class teachers on the morning of the 14^{th} .

SCHOOL—KEEP—CLEAR—

Parking is still an issue at drop off and pick up times. Vehicles have been parking on the KEEP CLEAR zigzag lines outside school. The zigzag lines are in place at this location to provide a clear and safe place for children to cross the road. By parking on the zigzag lines you are placing children and adults in danger of on-coming traffic.

You will have noticed the increased presence of Traffic Wardens, this is due to us passing on reports from concerned parents to them. It was disappointing to receive these reports, particularly where a parent avoided an accident when another car mounted the pavement!

We do appreciate there is limited parking in the area, so either arrive early to guarantee a parking space or park a little further away and walk the short distance to school, all of which could help to ease the problem! Drivers who disregard parking regulations are liable to receive Fixed Penalty Fines and/or have their vehicles removed if causing an obstruction. **DON'T PUT YOUR CHILDREN'S SAFETY AT RISK**. Also, please DO NOT use the school driveway as a cut through or a drop off area, the car park is for staff and visitors only.

A FEW REMINDERS.....

<u>ATTENDANCE / PUNCTUALITY</u> — The School day starts at 8.50am, therefore the gates/doors will be opened at 8.40am and closed at 8.50am. Teachers will take registers at 8.50am so any children who arrive after 8.50am will miss the register and be recorded as late. The registers will remain open until 9.00am. Any child arriving after 9.00am will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Lateness is still an issue for some children. Mrs Turnbull (Admissions Officer) and I meet regularly to review attendance and do contact some parents to highlight lower than expected attendance percentages or punctuality issues. This term so far we have had a total of 608 Lates (U or L) and our overall attendance to date for the term is 96.93%, we could do better!

<u>PLAYGROUND</u> - Please can we remind parents that children should not be using the play equipment before or after school. **NO SCOOTERS OR BIKES** should be ridden anywhere on the school grounds at any time and children should enter and exit their classrooms by walking. Also a reminder that dogs are not allowed in the playground.

<u>VOMITING AND DIARRHOEA 48-HOUR POLICY</u> - Can we please remind you that if your child experiences any vomiting / diarrhoea then they do need to be kept at home for 48 hours from the last bout of illness.

<u>PE & JEWELLERY</u> - Can we remind parents / carers that children are not allowed to wear any jewellery during PE lessons as it is WSCC Health and Safety Policy. The only jewellery permitted in school is a wristwatch and one pair of stud like earrings. If your child has recently or during a school holiday has their ears pierced it is up to you to provide micro pore type tape for them to put on for PE lessons.

Please can we ask you when returning any money to school for trips, pantomimes, school photos, tickets etc. if it could be returned to the school office in a sealed envelope with your child's class and name with the **CORRECT** amount of money inside as we can no longer issue change, thank you.

Book Recommendations

EYFS & K\$1 Many of you will have heard of Kes Gray and his books 'Oi Dog!', 'Oi Cat' and even 'Oi Goat!' We would highly recommend his new book, 'Oi, Duck-Billed Platypus!' which is a delight from start to finish, including the most weird and wonderful rhymes to go, not with *types* of animals, but their first names! Ask your teacher if they have a copy or find one in the wonderful children's section at Worthing Library.

K\$2 After the recent 100th anniversary of WWI Armistice Day we would recommend sharing one or two of the many wonderful books that are available. Here are a few suggestions:

- Remembrance day: 1918 Great Events by Gillian Clements (LKS2)
- Armistice Runner by Tom Palmer (fiction for UKS2)
- Armistice: A Laureate's Choice of Poems of War and Peace by Carol Ann Duffy
- The Armistice and the Aftermath: The Story in Art by John Fairley (a collections of paintings and drawings)
- The Great War Anthology: many top writers including Micheal Morpurgo, David Almond and John Boyne revisit the Great War. (plus amazing illustrations by Jim Kay who recently illustrated the Harry Potter series).
