The noticeboards are regularly updated. Please check these for any changes.



<u>VOLUNTEER READERS</u> Are you able to spare some time to come into school and help listen to children read? If you would like to be a volunteer reader, please come into the school office for more information on how to apply. Owing to the importance of ensuring all our children's safety, all parents who help in school must be police checked. Please do not let this put you off volunteering to help in school, as we really do value your help.

<u>CHILD SAFETY</u> It is vital that whenever somebody other than you or your partner is picking up your child from school we have the name of the person WRITTEN down and either given to the teacher in the morning or handed in to the office. This is the only way in which we can ensure your child's safety at the end of the school day. If you have an emergency or are delayed you can, of course, telephone the office but we cannot take late telephone calls within normal circumstances.

<u>PE KIT</u> Please ensure that your child has their full PE kit in school every day, including <u>waterproof</u> <u>trainers</u>, as half of their PE lessons (particularly KS2) take place outdoors and sometimes across in the park. If your child does not have their kit in school, they will miss out on their lesson. Shorts and PE shirts can be purchased from the school office. It is advisable that children do have a warm tracksuit for the colder, wetter weather!
