



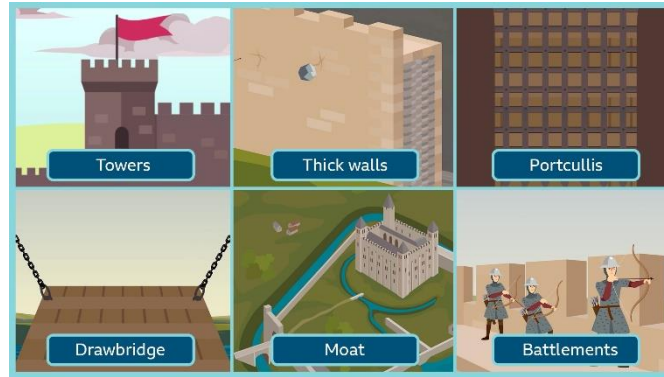

<p>The monarch in Great Britain resides in Buckingham Palace, London. This is a very popular tourist destination. A National Anthem is sung by a country or nation as a sign of respect for the reigning monarch. In Britain, this is God Save The King. Previously, it was God Save The Queen.</p> <p>Heir or heiress refers to the individual who will become the next monarch in what is called the line of succession. William the Conqueror is famous for fighting off his enemies to become king.</p>	<p>Power, monarchy and government – the role of the monarchy has changed overtime to work in conjunction with parliament/government</p> <p>Historical change – the monarch might change through events i.e. death or abdication</p>
