- Understand how Christians use worship to seek forgiveness and spread love.

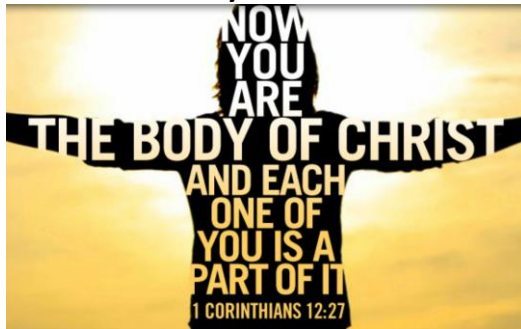
### Vocabulary:

<b>Pentecost</b>	Christian festival celebrating the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples of Jesus after His Ascension.
<b>Holy Spirit</b>	Part of the trinity that provides the fruit of the spirit
<b>Body of Christ</b>	This metaphor describes the Christian Church as a unified body, with Jesus as its head and all believers as members.
<b>Fellowship</b>	The union of believers in Christ, both with God and with each other
<b>Kingdom of God</b>	A new way of living and thinking where God's will is done.
